Metro Hardwoods Discount Program

April 3rd 2021 club meeting minutes

FHW Meeting Minutes, April 3, 2021, 9:00 am via Zoom for newsletter

A total of 32 people participated in the monthly zoom meeting including members from the South Kansas Woodturners Club of Wichita and Kansas Area Woodturners of Topeka.

Reports:

- President David Delker: We currently have 65 members and the Club is doing well in this challenging time. The Board meets regularly to discuss issues and opportunities. Ray Case is doing a great job of updating the Club's website so check it out!
- VP Vaughn Graber: Member names have been sent to Hartville tool for their Club discounts.
- Programs Steve Bietau: The demonstration schedule for the remainder of the year has been completed and can be found in the April FHW newsletter.
- Operations Tom Shields: The Pumpkin Patch Arts & Crafts Fair will be held at Cico Park on October 8th & 9th.

New business: Due to the first Saturdays of July and September falling on Independence Day and Labor Day weekends, we will move our Club meeting, for those two months only, to the second Saturdays (July 10th and Sept. 11th).

Demonstration: Steve Bietau gave a back-to-basics spindle turning demonstration. Tools for spindle turning include spindle roughing gouges, skew chisels, spindle gouges, and detail gouges. Start by finding the centers at each end of your blank and mount with a steb center or spur center and your live center. Round your square blank

with a spindle roughing gouge. For beads and coves, keep in mind the ABC's of turning: anchorbevel-cut. Anchor the tool on the tool rest. Lightly contact the surface of the wood with the bevel of the tool but not the cutting edge. While maintaining bevel contact, move the tool handle toward the direction of the cut to slowly bring the cutting edge into contact with the wood to begin the cut. Beads can be cut with a skew or spindle gouge. Using the long point of the skew, make a V cut, then open up the V from each side with the short point of the skew or with a spindle gouge. Anchor the tool, keeping the handle low, then slowly raise the handle until the bevel comes into contact with what will be the crown of the bead. Rotate while lifting the tool handle to roll-cut down to the V-groove. For coves, anchor the spindle gouge with handle lowered and flute facing the center of the cove. Slowly lift the handle to start cutting, rotating the flute to face up as you get to the center of the cove. Cut a small cove from one side to the center, then from the other side to the center. Continue until the cove is the desired size. With practice, you can become proficient at turning beads and coves.

Our next meeting will be May 1st with a demonstration of resin casting by Steve Hougham.
