State-of-the-Club Report

Inspiration!

I just read survey results in which people in the U.S. rated January and February as their least-favorite months. Perhaps the crummy weather has something to do with that, or it may be that people feel let down after the holidays. I was feeling rather down recently myself, as I started gathering the piles of paperwork with which to file my income tax return.

Luckily, my attitude improved significantly when I set aside the paperwork and returned to the workshop after a few weeks of inactivity. What inspired me? It was our recent interactive remote demonstration by Rudy Lopez on turning thin-stemmed goblets. I chose a relatively warm day to tromp around in the backyard to find the perfect limbs to turn into goblets. I'm pleased to report that 100% of my goblets were successful. O.K., I only turned two of them, but I'm still pleased!

That simple exercise taught me several things:

• I learned how to keep the thin goblet stem from oscillating by fastening the bowl of the goblet to the tailstock and then putting the workpiece under tension, rather than compression. by refining the stem diameter to 1/8" with my trusty 1/2" micro skew chisel.

- I learned that sharp tools are a necessity when working with thin goblet stems.
- I learned that green goblet stems dry and distort rather quickly, so don't take a lunch break and expect to return after lunch (like I did) and find your creation to be the same as you left it.
- I learned that fuzzy bark on a Russian Olive branch can whack your fingers and leave little cuts that are not even noticeable until you wash your hands later.
- I learned that focusing on how to make the next cut with your lathe tool completely obliterates negative thoughts about the pandemic, income tax, politics, and other obstacles to enjoying life!

Anyway, I learned a lot and had fun with a new woodturning challenge, all because of another great demonstration our club provided. I'll share some photos of my finished pieces during our Show and Tell segment at our next meeting.

By the way, my income tax paper piles are still on the table where I left them. I've got plenty of time to finish that stuff, but first, my workshop is calling me!

Yes, the Board members decided to meet virtually again for the February meeting.

Unfortunately, we are riding the crest of a wave of COVID cases right now. 
