Show & Tell: Presenters included: Victor Schwarz, Gary Burgert, Dennis Biggs, Kate Cahoj, Dan Zeller, Robert Kloppenborg, Heather Marusiak, and Lowell Regehr.

Demonstration: Member Dennis Biggs demonstrated twice-turned bowls with bead embellishments. Information included how to initially turn a bowl to 10% when wood is wet, how to seal with wax, and best ways to dry the roughed-out bowl to prevent cracking. Once dry, the bowl can be finished. Dennis covered methods to chuck and reverse chuck, shape considerations, preferred tools, beading techniques, and preferred finishing products.

Meeting adjourned at 11:00 am.
