#### Officer Reports:

**Demonstration**: Member Daniel Dubois demonstrated eccentric turning, which is multi-axis turning without a fixed tail stock axis or support. This results in the axis of rotation being in a different alignment than the geometric axis of the workpiece. Information included safety considerations, preferred wood species and size, lathe speed, preferred tools, chucking, shaping, and finishing techniques. An informative handout was provided. 


