Take HWY 24 East toward Wamego to Flush Road. Flush is 5.5 miles from the HWY 24/Tuttle Creek intersection and is flagged with a speed limit of 60 mph. Go left (North) on Flush Rd for 7.2 miles.

From Wamego:

Take HWY 24 West toward Manhattan to Flush Road. Flush is 7.3 miles from the KS-99/HWY 24 intersection and is flagged with a speed limit of 60 mph. Go right (North) on Flush Rd for 7.2 miles.

Please park and enter the building through the door by the greenhouse.


The next meeting will be April 6.


Meeting adjourned at 10:25 AM.
