
#### From Manhattan:

Take HWY 24 East toward Wamego to Flush Road. Flush Road is 5.7 miles from the McCall/HWY 24 intersection and is flagged with a speed limit of 60 mph. Go left (North) on Flush Rd for 7.2 miles.

#### From Wamego:

Take HWY 24 West toward Manhattan to Flush Road. Flush Road is 7.3 miles from the KS-99/HWY 24 intersection and is flagged with a speed limit of 60 mph. Go right (North) on Flush Rd for 7.2 miles.

#### A Simple Time Saver for Woodturners

Putting a turning tool back in the rack on the wall after using it and exchanging it for another consumes a lot of time when done repeatedly. And putting tools on the lathe bed when not being used only invites a tool to fall to the floor and get damaged. Neither are a good solution for keeping your woodturning tools while turning a project.

A simple solution is to make from scrap wood a tray and place it right in front of your lathe like the one in the picture. It's a lot easier and wastes little time to place your tools on this tray when they are not being used. This simple tray can be quickly made, and it needs to be located close at hand. 




