

May 11, 2024, 9:00 am at Rock Creek High School, Saint George, KS.

A total of 18 people attended in person and seven attended via zoom: three FHW members and four members of the Kansas Association of Woodturners, Topeka KS.

Officer Reports:

President – Tom Shields: Today's meeting is an interactive remote demonstration by Ron Tomasch. Due to the need for time for the demonstration we will not be having Show & Tell today. Also, because we will be here through the noon hour, the Club will provide pizza. We had good participation at the Flint Hills Festival including Tom Shields, Tom Boley, Ross Hirst, Melissa McIntyre, Barbara Drolet, Ken Stitt, Heather Marusiak, and Don Baker. The Pumpkin Patch Arts and Crafts event is Oct 12th (9am to 5 pm) on Poyntz Ave, Downtown Manhattan. We will be looking for volunteers for that event.

VP – Tod Salfrank: No Report

May Meeting Minutes

Demonstration -An interactive remote demonstration was provided by Ron Tomasch from Geneva Ohio on turning a cowboy hat. Information included cutting the blank from the freshly felled log, chucking, measuring the customer's head and adding amounts to account for the final thickness and shrinkage. Ron showed and discussed the general shaping, preferred tools for shaping, and the use of light in turning thin. He discussed considerations of the brim size for cowboy hats vs. outback hats, band size, and how to color the band with ebony and padauk. Once turned, Ron showed how he shapes the hat to get the signature curve of the brim and the resulting oval shape to fit the customer's head.

The next meeting will be June 1.

Meeting adjourned at 1:10 PM.


From Wamego:

Please park and enter the building through the door by the greenhouse.











Mentoring Opportunities
