FHW Meeting Minutes, Oct 5, 2024, 9:00 am at Rock Creek High School, Saint George, KS.

A total of 26 members attended in-person.

Officer Reports:

President – Tom Shields: November is Board elections month. Several 2024 officers are willing to serve another year. They include President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Programs, and AAW/WIT Liaison. We will need a volunteer to serve as Operations officer. Next month the slate of officers will be presented to the Club for a vote.

Dues will remain at \$40 for the year.

The Board has agreed to use some of the Cub's budget to pay for an in-person demo and at least two interactive remote demonstrations (IRDs) in 2025.

The Board also discussed the lack of members coming to the meetings. We have 45-50 paid members, yet often only 20-25 come to meetings. If you know of members who aren't coming, please reach out to them and find out why, and encourage them to start coming again.

VP – Tod Salfrank: There are issues with the cables today so no zoom is available. Anyone willing and able to help on Friday afternoon's before meetings to set up and those able to stay after meetings to help break down would be very much appreciated.

Treasurer – Ross Hirst – The Club treasury balance is \$3064.41 with \$93.51 in petty cash. Last month the Club had an expenditure of \$174.53 for our yearly Zoom license, and \$59.13 for Club business cards.

Programs – Tom Boley: Today is Tom Shields demonstrating a Christmas ornament with plenty of time for members to turn one before Christmas. In November, Steve Bietau will give a hollowing demonstration. In December, we will have an IRD with Rudy Lopez. In January, Tom will demonstrate spindle turning and provide up to two associated skill enhancement classes for members interested in getting hands-on experience. Randy Zelenka will demonstrate in February.

Operations – Robert Kloppenborg: The Pumpkin Patch Arts & Crafts event in Manhattan is next Saturday from 9 AM to 5 PM. Set up is 8-9 and break down is 5-6. A sign up sheet is being passed around. Please come help whether to set up, turn, visit with the crowd, or break down. It will be a warm day so plan ahead. Steve Bietau has graciously volunteered the use of his booth tent so we will have shade.

Last week Robert came down to talk with the woodworking class at Rock Creek. Three students showed interest. The Board agreed last meeting that we would provide free membership to any student wanting to join the Club.

Robert also reported that Rock Creek was just starting an audio visual club, so maybe eventually some students will be willing/able to help us with A/V.

AAW Liaison/WIT/Newsletter— Heather Marusiak: The AAW POP show exhibition is starting. The theme is "Open/Closed" boxes that must be no larger than 6" x 6" x 6". Heather will help with photography if members are interested. There is an online auction for items started by the late Bill Luce and finished by several wood turning artists who specialize in post-turning embellishment. Heather is one of them. Bidding will start on Oct 12th and conclude Oct 26th. The link for the auction can be found in the newsletter.

Secretary - Barbara Drolet: No report.

Other business: Steve Bietau talked to the Club about a RoboRest sharpening jig. This is something he uses all the time. Although no longer available, he did find a similar product called a Right Angle jig in the back of an AAW magazine. He contacted the company and there is a possibility of getting a 10% discount off the \$150 price with free shipping if the Club does a group order. Steve will bring one in next month as part of his demonstration to show how it works and to see if there is interest in a group order.

Show & Tell: Presenters included: Tom Shields, Bob Holcombe, Victor Schwarz, Dennis Biggs, Terry Schmidt, David Delker, Kenneth Stitt, and Heather Marusiak.

Demonstration – Club member Tom Shields demonstrated a very clever Christmas ornament with top and bottom finials and a twisted wire spherical center. Information included blank size and considerations of top and bottom finial proportions, the use of the indexing feature on the lathe to make an indexing jig for use with a V-block on the drill press to drill 12 equidistant holes in the finial blanks, and the advantages using a collet chuck to secure spindle blanks when shaping finials. Tom then demonstrated how he twists red and green wires to get an even tightness and how he glues them into the finials for the final ornament. This makes a beautiful Christmas gift!

The next meeting will be Nov 2.

Meeting adjourned at 12:50 PM.





















































Open Call for ALL to Participate: WIT Wig Stand Initiative

The AAW Women in Turning is encouraging all chapters to join in a national project to turn wig stands at no expense for the recipients. The wig stands are donated to local partnering organizations that give away free wig stands to those in need. The partners may be hospitals, oncology clinics, cosmetology programs, or other organizations that support people undergoing cancer treatment. The goal is to give back to our community, especially as cancer has likely impacted each of us, our family, or our friends.



Wig stand requirements:

Top: 1 1/2"–2" thick x 5" diameter disk Base: 1 1/2"–2" thick x 6" diameter disk

Stem: 10"-13" x 1.5 x 1.5 block

- Any species of dry wood will work for this project. It may be solid or glued.
- Stand must be smooth and free of any sharp, jagged edges.
- Stand may be naturally finished or artistically embellished.
- Stand must be finished with POLYURETHANE.
- This is an ongoing project with no deadline for completion.

From Manhattan:

Take HWY 24 East toward Wamego to Flush Road. Flush Road is 5.7 miles from the McCall/HWY 24 intersection and is flagged with a speed limit of 60 mph. Go left (North) on Flush Rd for 7.2 miles.

From Wamego:

Take HWY 24 West toward Manhattan to Flush Road. Flush Road is 7.3 miles from the KS-99/HWY 24 intersection and is flagged with a speed limit of 60 mph. Go right (North) on Flush Rd for 7.2 miles.

Please park and enter the building through the door by the greenhouse.











Mentoring Opportunities
